I. Announcements

- A. The Cuyahoga County SRAD/OVI Taskforce has **won the International Association of Chief's of Police Law Enforcement Challenge for the third year in a row!** Congratulations!!
1. This year the taskforce tied for first place with the Smooth Operator program. This taskforce includes Maryland, Virginia and Washington D.C.

- B. We had **50 minutes of earned media for our 4th of July crackdown!!!**

II. Old Business

- A. 4th of July OVI Warrant Sweep Detail – Thank you to everyone who participated in the event. It was a great success!
1. Results:
 - a. officers attempted to serve 69 warrants
 - b. 16 warrants were successfully served
 2. Media results: Thanks to Mark Kwiatkowski and Bedford Heights, Bob Sackett and Garfield Hts, Strongsville, Parma Hts, Euclid, and Seven Hills for all of your work with the media!
 - a. 50 minutes of television earned media! We were on 3, 5, 19/43 and Fox 8.
 - b. The sweep was on WTAM and all Clear Channel radio stations' news broadcasts before the sweep as well as reporting the results after the event.
 - c. 3 newspaper articles were placed as well
 - d. Websites: we were on all of the Cleveland news websites, as well as: msnbc, Cleveland.com, automotive.com, Yahoo News, and news sites in Palm Springs, Boise, Miami/Ft. Lauderdale, Cincinnati, Dayton, Columbia, SC, New York, Boston and Findlay.
 - e. If your local papers covered the sweep, please give copies to Chrystal.
 - f. We will have copies of the media clips for each of your departments by the next meeting.

III. New Business

- A. ***Over the Limit. Under Arrest. Mobilization enforcement.*** August 17th – September 3rd.
- Wolf Packs – adapted from a program conducted in Tempe, Arizona.
 - Coordinated saturation patrols Friday and Saturday nights for the three weekends during OTLUA.
 - Saturation patrol areas include 4-8 departments (at least 2 cars each). We need officers that will make a lot of stops.
 - Use checkpoints as base of operations for media.
 - Have participating agencies meet at checkpoint for “briefing” for the media.
 - Depending upon courts and other considerations, have officers bring suspects to BATmobiles for testing and/or arrest.
 - Report numbers to Chrystal by 2:00 pm on Sunday for after action media release.
 - Please see Map and Wolf Pack schedule (tentative).
- B. ***Over the Limit. Under Arrest. PI&E effort*** – August 17 – September 3rd.
- Partnership with TEAM (Techniques for Effective Alcohol Management) and the American League Central Division. (tentative) Cleveland will be competing with Chicago, Detroit, Kansas City and Minneapolis to see which city can gather the most Designated Driver pledges during the OTLUA time period.
 - Pledges will be collected at the ball fields, the TEAM and MLB websites.
 - We are looking for pledge collection sites around the area. Ex. Winking Lizard, car dealerships
 - The winning city will win a plaque to be displayed in the Club’s front office.
 - A winner will be picked from the pledges of the winning city for a prize package that may include: tickets, first pitch and batting practice with the team.

- e. There will be radio promotions as well as promotions on-site at the ball fields.
 - f. We are in the planning stages of a pledge drive kick-off on September 15th.
 - 2. We will have point-of-sale and collateral for distribution to permit holders.
 - 3. Please make sure you distribute our checkpoint info fliers at any upcoming checkpoints. Don't forget to customize them.
- C. **NightCAP Patrols** – Operation NightCAP (nighttime concentrated alcohol patrol) is continuing.
- 1. Friday and Saturday nights, 10:00 pm – 3:00 am
 - 2. Please make sure that your officers are out at high risk times this summer.
 - 3. Nick has looked at our county's fatal crashes and has found that a disproportionate number occur on Friday and Saturday nights.
 - 4. A press release with this weekend's enforcement will go out with Euclid PD as the contact. Euclid will be conducting a checkpoint on Friday and Lyndhurst and N. Royalton are conducting saturation patrols. Anyone else conducting enforcement this weekend? Please make sure you press release NightCAPs. If you can collaborate with nearby jurisdictions, that will make the effort stronger.
 - 5. Please consider using the portable programmable signboards to increase messaging.

IV. Reminders:

- A. 2007 Grant Update sheets. Please review the information contained in the table, answer the questions, sign and fax back to 216-844-7841 by Friday, July 27th. If you won't be able to spend down or conduct the number of checkpoints in your contract, please let Chrystal know ASAP.
- B. We **MUST** meet the following requirements. Take a minute to look at your schedule and mark down the dates of your checkpoints and saturation patrols on the enforcement calendar – even if they are tentative. The enforcement calendar is being passed around.
 - 1. **JULY:** We are required to conduct 10 checkpoints in July. North Royalton, Euclid (2), Olmsted Falls, Parma Heights, Cleveland (3) have checkpoints scheduled. We need two more. Does anyone else have a July checkpoint scheduled?
 - 2. **AUGUST:** We are required to conduct 13 checkpoints in August to support the *Over the Limit. Under Arrest*. National mobilization. South Euclid, Garfield Hts., Euclid, Berea, Seven Hills, Olmsted Falls, Bedford Heights and North Royalton have scheduled checkpoints. ***See Over the Limit. Under Arrest.***
 - 3. **SEPTEMBER:** We are required to conduct 6 checkpoints in September. Euclid, Garfield Hts., South Euclid and Parma have scheduled checkpoints. We need two more. Does anyone else have a September checkpoint scheduled?
